

Senior Checklist

June

- Set up to re-take TAKS in July if you did not pass the first time
- If necessary, take the SAT/ACT
- Begin researching different colleges through Internet, counselors
- Mail letters to colleges you like
- Attend football camp at a college
- Work hard to be in great shape at the beginning of the season!
- Keep records of all your college contacts
- Register with the Selective Service at the Post Office within 30 days of your 18th birthday. This is Federal Law! You must be registered to receive college financial aid!

July

- Work hard to be in great shape at the beginning of the season!
- Keep records of all your college contacts
- Make a college wish list: where you want to go, what you want to study

August

- Report any new test scores
- Prepare to play great-especially early in the year
- If necessary, sign up for the November or December SAT/ACT
- Make as high grades as possible, especially in your core classes
- Begin applying to colleges-fill out a general application at www.applytexas.org Check your deadlines and requirements
- Stop by the counselor's office to research different colleges
- Double-check with your counselor to make sure you have all your classes set up to graduate in the spring

September

- Play great to start the year!
- Keep all records of all your college contacts
- Make your grades!

October

- Continue to play great!
- Make your grades!
- Watch for information sheets coming from the counselor's office and listen to announcements for available scholarships

November

- Continue to play great! Go far in the playoffs
- Keep records of all your college contacts
- Begin setting up your college visits
- Make your grades!

December

- Pick up FAFSA form in the counselor's office
- Continue applying to colleges-fill out a general application at www.applytexas.org
- If necessary, take the ACT/SAT Test and keep coaches informed of any developments
- Begin visiting colleges
- Double-check with your counselor to make sure you have all your classes set up to graduate in the spring
- Pass all your classes for the semester!

January

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- Turn in your FAFSA-Online or in the mail. Use last year's taxes to estimate income
- Keep the coaches informed of any developments
- Continue visiting colleges and get ready to make a decision about where you will be going
- Watch for information sheets coming from the counselor's office and listen to announcements for available scholarships
- Make your grades!

February

- Fill out a standard scholarship application at the counselor's office
- Keep the coaches informed of any developments
- Watch for information sheets coming from the counselor's office and listen to announcements for available scholarships
- Sign up to take the THEA test Check to see if you are exempt. www.thea.nesinc.com

March

- Keep the coaches informed of any developments
- If necessary, take the SAT/ACT test
- Get a copy of your immunization records from the clinic
- Make your grades!

April

- Apply for Bob Moore Scholarship
- Keep coaches informed of any developments
- If necessary take the SAT/ACT
- Make your grades!

May

- Request a final transcript from counselor
- Come to the Spring Game and see how good the Porcupines will be next year!
- Graduate!
- Register for Freshman orientation at the college you will be attending

June

- Take a summer school class at a local college
- College orientation. Take copies of all your records
